RASPBERRY PI COMPETITION

During this year's national Raspberry Pi competition students from across the country were invited to invent a programme that would transform travel and transport using a Raspberry Pi, the credit-card-size computer.

The competition theme provided competitors with an opportunity to create solutions to tackle security issues, create a better experience for people with physical mobility challenges, or create the perfect yet least environmentally damaging journey.

Thanks to the Development Fund a team of Year 10 students had the opportunity to compete in the national final of the competition, pitching their impressive facial recognition project to a panel of high profile business leaders and technology experts.

IPAD AND APPS TO SUPPORT MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Funding enabled us to purchase an iPad and apps to support the mental health and wellbeing of our students, using new technology to help them learn new strategies to support them in their learning. This pastoral project led by our Learning Support team, has enabled students to observe the physical impact of calming strategies thanks to a new heart monitor.

CHESS CLUB

Funding from the Development Fund and Parents' Association has provided outdoor chess sets, subscriptions to chess magazines, access to online resources, and books which provide players with analysis and assistance. Launched in 2017 by two Old Blues, Chess Club is now one of the most popular extra-curricular clubs at Blue Coat, with students starting to compete in competitions such as the Merseyside Chess Association's Junior League.

3D PRINTER AND DRONE CLUB

3D printing and Rapid Prototyping is the design world's favoured method of model making, and our Design Technology students have eagerly anticipated the arrival of our new 3D printer. Funded by the Development Fund and the Parents' Association, this exciting piece of equipment has led to the creation of new extra-curricular clubs, including Drone Club, for students wanting to develop their knowledge and understanding.

GOPROS

Support from the Parents' Association and Development Fund has equipped our PE Department with a number of GoPro cameras, enabling our students studying PE GCSE, as well as extra-curricular sports teams, to capture and evaluate their performances and develop their strengths.

UK MATHEMATICS TRUST TEAM CHALLENGE

Having won the regional final of the UKMT Team Challenge, our students were invited to the national final in London to tackle a variety of engaging mathematical activities.

Throughout the day we had to solve problems across a wide spectrum of mathematical topics and make a poster relating to Euclid's postulates. The day went really well and we came 31st out of 88. WIRRAL FESTIVAL OF MUSIC AND DRAMA

During the spring term our 23 strong brass ensemble entered the Wirral Festival of Music and Drama, in the secondary school ensemble class. Our talented band put in an excellent performance and they were awarded a distinction by the adjudicator who praised their excellent balance, strong, warm tone and bold playing.

Representing Blue Coat for the first time was Year 7 student and trumpet player Alexandra.

THE BRITISH PHYSICS OLYMPIAD

This year 154 students from Years 10 to 13 competed in the British Physics Olympiad, a prestigious competition organised by Oxford University. Designed to recognise excellence in young physicists, the challenge allows students to have fun problem solving and develop the skills required for admission to top universities.

Year 10 student Tabitha's fantastic achievement during this year's competition resulted in an invitation to Oxford University's Physics' Department for a Masterclass. Alongside fellow top gold scorers from around the country Tabitha will receive tuition in problem solving skills and will obtain a flavour of physics at university.

WE BELIEVE OUTSTANDING STUDENTS DESERVE AN OUTSTANDING LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

This year we have continued to work hard on our Bright Minds Bright Futures campaign, getting one step closer to creating a new state-of-the-art Learning Resource Centre for our students. We have outstanding students and we believe outstanding students deserve the very best learning environment, resources and equipment to support them in achieving their potential. A School library should be an intellectually stimulating environment that inspires our students and ignites their creativity and passion for learning. However, in its current state our library falls far short of this promise.

We've worked with our students to create an exciting vision and design for a new LRC which will become a hub for learning in School, a space to collaborate and a space to breathe, which will:

- **Feature dedicated areas for quiet study, group working and reading for pleasure**
- **Have more resources to support academic studies, personal development, careers and leisure reading**
- **Be an uplifting space where students want to be and where they want to learn**
- **Be an oasis of calm**

Our new LRC will also create a step-change in our social mobility programme, providing the space and resource to engage with more local children from disadvantaged backgrounds.

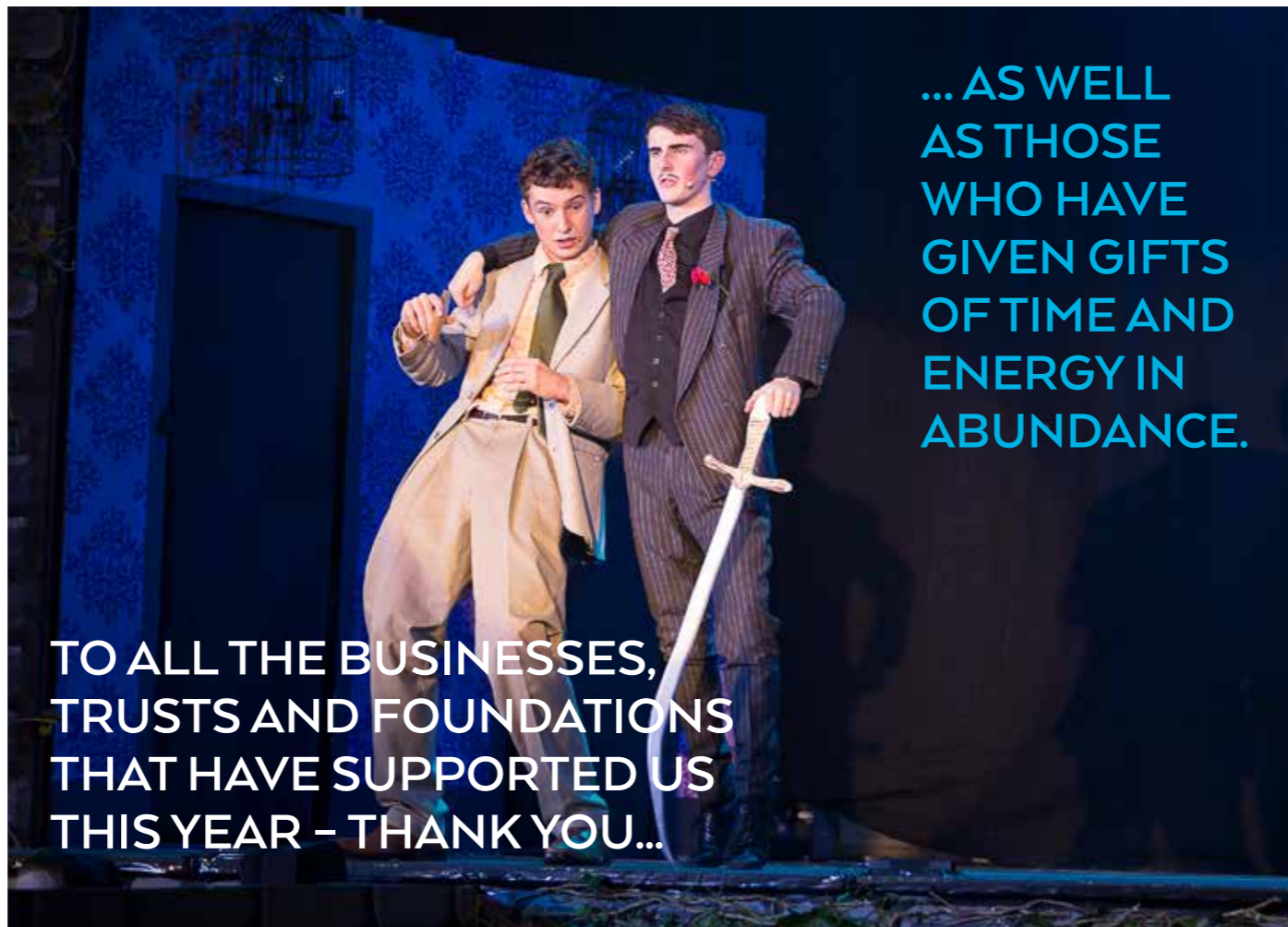

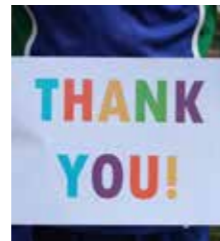
